The course remains accessible in all partner languages, supporting long-term use by professionals in <u>Denmark</u>, <u>Greece & Cyprus</u>, <u>Germany</u>, <u>the Netherlands</u>, <u>Portugal</u>, <u>Slovenia</u>, and <u>Spain</u>.



The GSCG Toolkit Is Complete

The Gender-Sensitive Career Guidance Toolkit (GSCG Toolkit) has also been finalised and published in English, with national versions soon available in all partners' languages.

It serves as a practical reference guide filled with strategies, examples, and reflective tools that help integrate gender equality principles into career guidance.


Multiplier Events Across Europe

To share the project's results and engage stakeholders, partners are hosting national Multiplier Events in October 2025:

Denmark

The Danish Multiplier Event was held on 10 October 2025 at SOSU Østjylland in Aarhus, bringing together 21 attendees to explore the project's results.

Participants were introduced to the GUIDE e-learning course, the GSCG Toolkit, and engaged in hands-on sessions using the project's co-creation and career decision-making tools.

Greece

The Greek Multiplier Event, held in Patras on 21 October 2025, brought together educators, counsellors, and professionals to explore inclusive approaches in career guidance. Under the title "Gender Sensitive Approaches in career Guidance", participants engaged with the project's final tools—the e-course and the GSCG Toolkit—and discussed how these can support equality in everyday counselling practice.

Multiplier Events Across Europe

Slovenia

On 22 October, the Slovenian team successfully hosted the online event called Your Practice Counts: How to Consider Gender in Career Guidance, which brought together 30 participants from various fields of counselling and HR. After a short interactive welcome, Dr Majda Hrženjak from the Peace Institute delivered a powerful keynote on gender and the labour market. Her presentation resonated strongly with participants and sparked meaningful reflection. The event continued with a presentation of the GUIDE project, including its goals, partnerships and especially key outputs. Participants were then invited to try out the Co-creating Counselling Model in breakout rooms, where they took on different roles (counsellor, client, observers) and practised short counselling sessions with gender in mind.

One participant shared: "I really liked how the event was structured – we moved from theory to practice and even had a chance to train a bit. Well done!" "A highly meaningful topic that deserves attention."

The final discussion highlighted the importance of inclusive guidance and raised the question: How can we encourage others to recognise its value? The event concluded with a short evaluation, where participants expressed high satisfaction and interest in using the project's tools in their own practice.



These events bring together professionals, educators, and policymakers to discuss real-life applications and ensure the sustainability of the project's impact across Europe.
